From Woods Hole to Provincetown, he wrote, designed, and directed a scintillating set of entertainments starring local actors and his own troupe of handmade puppets. Chief producer of Goreys plays was his friend and neighbor Carol Verburg. Now she tells how he did it. From The Helpless Doorknob and The Gilded Bat to Horror at Hamstrung Hall and Porptiga, she chronicles Goreys adventures in drama, puppetry, opera, and even (briefly) acting.
